Rajasthan, in spite of being a desert, has been endowed with beautiful sites that include various palaces, forts and pilgrim centres that define what Rajasthan is. The architectural beauty of Rajasthan is world renowned, forts, palaces, havelis, tombs, cenotaph and sculptures present across the geography of state, reveal the blend of multiple dynasties that ruled the ancient lands. Rajasthan has a rich heritage of its peculiar Art Culture & Architecture. Many of these art forms have survived through ages and are even part of present culture of Rajasthan. Renowned academicians and practitioners will be invited to deliver lectures ensuring the fulfillment of course objectives. The competence of the institution and the availability of subject experts at a historic place make this programme unique and unparalleled.

During the programme the participants will be benefitted out of the study tour to the District Court; High Court; State Judicial Academy; Central Jail; and places of historical and cultural importance.
