1. Course Name: Women Entrepreneurship and Start-ups: Empowerment through

Innovation

2. Duration: Two weeks

3. Justification for offering the course:

Women are very important for imitating social changes in any country. They are sensitive, sincere, and straightforward in their approach and believe more in cooperation rather than competition. The empowerment of women through start-ups has proved to be a turnaround in many economies. In many countries, they have been deprived of education and opportunities to start their own venture. This programme with an emphasis on Empowerment through Innovation will demonstrate concrete examples of Indian success stories of women start-ups, highlight Indian policy and Governmental setup forwomen entrepreneurship and start-ups, provide industry connections for opening mutually beneficial commercial or policy level engagements and train the trainers to select and nurture women for their start-ups. It is hoped that after undergoing the various experiences, assignments, input-cum-discussion sessions, games, and case studies, the participants will be able to suggest suitable policies, develop case studies, ecosystem and provide industry connect to open mutually beneficial commercial or policy level engagementsand conduct startup programmes which will empower women in society.

4. Rationale:

In order to encourage start-ups as carrier options for women, Start-up Awareness Camps and Start-up Promotion Programmes/camps need to be organized at Ministry/Department/Institute level. Such programmes need to be carefully planned and conducted by competent persons who have the requisite capabilities not only to deliver content but also to motivate/counsel students. The present programme has been planned

specifically for the policymakers, administrators, officers, academicians, consultants, trainers & other professionals engaged in women entrepreneurship and start-ups who will be developing policies and working as Startup/Entrepreneurship Trainer-motivator in their respective institutions or communities. The main focus of the course is towards the development of policy framework and abilities, which are required by trainers to formulate conducive policies, develop the congenial ecosystem, and connect industry and government for effective conduction of such programmes. Some of these are selecting potential start-up cofounders, conducting creativity sessions, achievement motivation training, preparation of business plan etc. The participants will be exposed to the training methodology to deliver the inputs to achieve the objectives of Startup programmes.

Participants of the ITEC program will be acquainted with stages to establish a start-up like Ideating (Design Thinking), Concepting (Teaming, Bootstrapping), Committing (Minimum Viable Plan), and Validating (Business Model Canvas, Product-Market Fit, IPR), Scaling, and Establishing. The success of an enterprise depends upon the competencies of an entrepreneur, systematic planning in the establishment of an enterprise, creativity, and innovation in business processes, achievement motivation, consumer-oriented marketing strategies, interfacing social media for business promotion, emotional intelligence, goal setting, and business communications. The importance of these topics along with strategies to use them will be developed in the program participants. Concepts will be shared by actual case studies for a holistic picture. A project simulation will help participants to understand the nitty-gritties of the entrepreneurship and start-up programs.
