TRAINING PROGRAM ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING & CITIZEN SECURITY FOR THE JUDGES OF REPUBLIC OF PERU

COURSE CONTENT

The National Judicial Academy is organizing a five days' 'Training Programme on Human Trafficking and Citizen Security for the Judges of Republic of Peru' from 4th to 8th November 2024.

This training program aims to foster an exchange of experiences to enhance the quality of judicial services. The primary goal of this exchange is to establish mutual collaboration, with the overarching objective of improving the justice delivery mechanism. The program will include sessions on constitutional, civil, criminal, human rights laws, judicial skills, principles of natural justice and correlative jurisprudence. The program will provide an insight into the architecture of Indian constitutional arrangement, highlighting the constitutional vision of justice focusing on the role and vision of courts encompassing expanding horizons of liberty. The program also aims to focus on the menace of human trafficking with emphasis on the legal framework in India, international instruments, vulnerability of the victims/witnesses, evidentiary issues and compensatory jurisprudence. Developing an appropriate judicial persona while adjudicating cases relating to human trafficking shall also form part of the discourse. While giving the account of the Indian Judiciary the transition to a gender just society will be underscored. The evolution of Environmental jurisprudence along with the contribution of the Supreme Court of India and alignment with global standards will form part of the discourse. Civil and Criminal Justice Administration inclusive of Alternative Dispute Redressal System and Fair Trial will be accentuated, respectively. The program also aims to acquaint participants with elements of judicial behavior- ethics, neutrality and professionalism, skills of judging and judgment writing. The program will also facilitate discussions on court & case management and use of ICT in administration of justice as essential components of access to justice. Additionally, the program will address the issue of managing occupational stress in judges.
